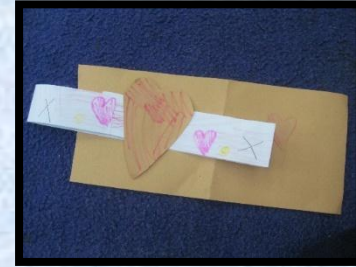


## Our Aims

# What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from age birth to 5. It is based on the recognition that children learn best through active learning and play. Children learn both indoors and outdoors. This is in small groups, whole class and directly during play.



Activities are planned to be adult led or child initiated and children will be encouraged to participate in all areas of the curriculum.

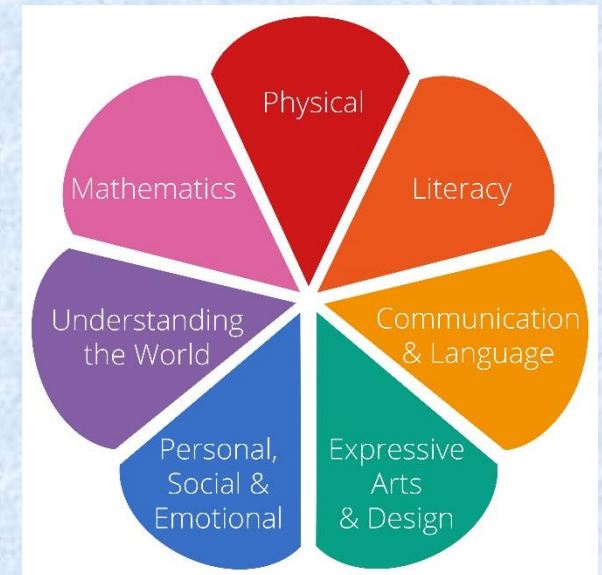


# The Early Years Foundation Stage Profile

- Information is shared with parents and carers through regular meetings throughout the year, Tapestry and an end of year report. A curriculum meeting will be held early in the Autumn term.





# School and Home Visits



- On Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> July 9 – 10 am prompt please bring your child to see their class and meet the staff.
- Children new to our school will be offered a home visit. Dates for these have been emailed, and will take place between Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September and Friday 5<sup>th</sup> September.

30 minutes late each day	19 days lost!



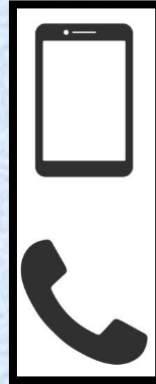

# Lunchtime routines

Children walk over with their Meal Time Supervisor (MTS) to the dinner hall in the Junior school. This is a member of the support staff in the class team so is a familiar adult.



We highly recommend your child has a school dinner, which is provided free of charge to all Infant children. However, you can provide a healthy packed lunch from home if you prefer. No nuts or chocolate (cakes, spread, biscuits).

## Extended Day



- Breakfast Club – children can arrive from 7.45 am and are taken to their classes at the beginning of the school day. This is charged at £4 per session or £3 if your child is Pupil Premium.

- After School Club – Rainbow Club is an after school club run by school staff. This runs from 3.15 to 6pm daily.
- Cost is £12 per day or £8 until 4.30pm.
- Reduced rates for pupil premium families.

PE Kit - White T-shirt, navy shorts/joggers, trainers with Velcro (only on PE days).





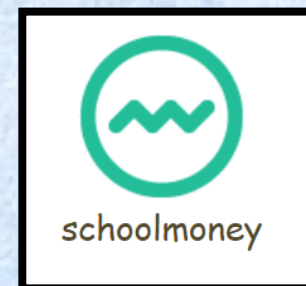
# Important information

Children will be provided with free milk until they are 5 years old unless they are Pupil Premium. After this you can pay for milk through Cool Milk.



Free fruit is available to have as a snack every day. They will also have access to water. No water bottles please – each child has their own named cup.

We are a cashless school and ask that any payments for school educational visits/events are paid via School Money. Please see the school website for more details. The office staff will be very happy to help you if you have any difficulties.





# Important information

Serious medical conditions will need a health care plan BEFORE your child starts school. Please let your teacher know if your child requires frequent medication such as an inhaler or has an EpiPen. We are a nut free school.



To celebrate your child's birthday a book can be donated to the class or plants/seeds to grow. Please give out invitations in the outdoor classroom. No party bags to be given out.

If your child bumps their head you will receive a text and a yellow letter explaining what happened. If it is a serious bump we will telephone you.



We can only give prescribed (regular) medication. If your child requires other medication you will need to come and administer it.



## How can I help?

- Talk to your child about what they have been doing at school.
- Read with your child everyday, including a bedtime story.
- Encourage your child to try first and be an independent learner.
- By providing them with clothes they can manage by themselves – trousers/skirts they can manage independently and Velcro shoes.
- Allowing your child to dress and undress themselves, practise putting their coat on and doing it up, putting on their own hats, scarves and gloves and so on. Practising good hygiene habits – using the toilet independently, handwashing and sneezing/blowing nose.
- Attend weekly reading mornings on a Friday 8.45 – 9am (once the children are settled).



# Parents as partners

- Tell us if your child is Pupil Premium as we receive extra funding to support their learning. They also continue to receive free milk.
- Attend workshops and parent meetings throughout the year.

- Upload to Tapestry to share information. If you are new to Tapestry please look at the Reception 2025 admissions section on our website for help.



- Engage with and support us with any additional support your child may receive.

- Please pay the Reception fund £2 each half term for cooking ingredients and resources for activities such as science experiments.



# Important information

Please do not allow siblings to play in our outdoor classroom before or after school. We have often set activities up for the day.

No children are allowed to go on either of the climbing frames before or after school – this also applies to older and younger siblings!

Please park safely outside our school and be considerate of our neighbours. There are cameras so please be careful where you stop.



Please end any telephone calls before collecting your child. No photographs should be taken on school trips or at events and shared on social media.
