Welcome to Year 1...

- School **attendance** is now a legal requirement
- Beginning of the **National Curriculum**
- **Transition** period for this half term includes access to **outdoor learning** environment
- Interactive whiteboard in each class and access to laptops
- A continued emphasis on learning through **practical activities**
- Focus on developing concentration skills and independence
- Continuous Teacher assessment and **phonic screening** in summer term
- Continue to have high expectations of behaviour.

Transition (Autumn 1st half)

- This half term, the classroom will look and feel like a Reception classroom. Making the 'unfamiliar' familiar.
- Children will have access to carefully planned play activities that are developmentally appropriate.
- There will be direct teaching (e.g. of reading, writing, daily phonics, daily guided reading with Teacher, maths and other subject areas), small group work and lots of opportunities for learning through play.
- Children will have access to the outdoor classroom. Whole class lessons will be gradually introduced to build up to a full time Year 1 timetable.
- Children will begin to bring home reading books (Mon/Wed and Fri)

After Transition

- A daily Mathematics and English lesson and daily guided reading
- Daily phonics lesson
- Other areas of the curriculum- History, Geography, Science, Art & DT, PE, RE, PSHE, Music and Computing
- Topic based curriculum
- Use of laptops for Computing and to support other subjects
- A continued focus on learning through practical and engaging activities

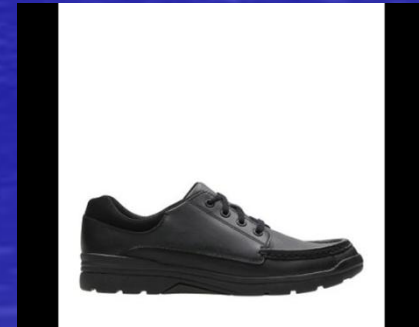
Be ready for school everyday



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English

- **Writing** lessons Monday to Thursday
- Will be following a new approach called "I'm a Clever Writer"
- Each week focusing on a **new skill** and a **new book**
- Following the I do, we do, you do approach
- Lessons include **Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar**
- **Phonics** lessons every day which involve the children learning to read and spell in an active and fun way.
- **Guided reading** takes place daily.

How to help with English

- Read with your child every day - children will bring home books every **Monday, Wednesday and Friday**
- Write a comment in the **reading diary** about your child's reading
- Practise **handwriting** regularly
- There will be '**Impact Workshops**' for parents in **Spring term** with a focus on improving writing
- Play games to support **phonics**
- Practise **spelling** the **days** of the week and **months**
- Use **everyday opportunities** to **read** and **write** e.g. write a shopping list or read a recipe

Handwriting

- In the **Autumn term**, we will continue to expect children to **print** letters as in Reception
- Ladder letters
l i t u j y
- Robot arm letters
r b n h m k p
- Curley caterpillar letters
c a o d g q e s f
- Odd bods - these are all formed differently
v w x z
- In the **Summer term** we may introduce **cursive** handwriting to some children if they are ready.

Maths

- **Daily** maths lesson
- We follow a Maths Mastery approach with an emphasis on **fluency, reasoning** and **problem solving skills**
- A longer time spent on Maths **skills** and **concepts** (e.g. addition) in order to **deepen** understanding
- Continued emphasis on **practical** approach using **concrete** and **pictorial** resources to support their learning
- Independent and sometimes paired activities
- Opportunities for learning at a **greater depth** and for additional support for children where needed

How to help with mathematics

- Practise counting, reading & writing numbers up to 100
- Counting forward and backwards in **steps of 1, 2, 5 and 10**.
- Recall of **number facts** e.g. number bonds to 5/10
- Practise recognising **coins and notes**
- Name and describe **2D shapes/3D shapes** e.g. triangle, pentagon, cube
- **Writing numerals** correctly e.g. 3,5,9 and **spelling words**
- **Measures** - length, weight, capacity, time
- Know **days** of the week and **months**

Half Term Topics

- Autumn 1: **Marvellous me**
- Autumn 2: **Up, Up and Away**
- Spring 1: **Wild Things**
- Spring 2: **Explorers**
- Summer 1: **Castles**
- Summer 2: **Splash**

Additional Support Groups

- Children may be given extra support in groups or on a 1:1 basis to **support**:
 - Mathematics / English
 - EMA- for children where English is not their 1st language
 - Gifted and Talented and more-able children through challenges in class to extend their thinking
 - Motor skills group
 - Emotional support - new PSHE curriculum is in place which has a greater emphasis on children's well being
